Sadly the First Lieutenant, Gillian Malouw Hector, and the two Warrant Officers, William Masela Mathipa and Mmokwapa Lucas Mojela, were drowned and the other four were hospitalised. The Submariners Association have already expressed their condolences and we in the Barrow Branch can only follow do the same. Another reminder that all Submarine operations involve a measure of risk.

# SUBMARINE LOSSES OF WWII OCTOBER 1943

Two Submarines were lost with all hands in October 1943. The first Submarine lost was:

#### Submarine P56 HMS USURPER

On 24th September 1943 HMS USURPER left Algiers for a patrol off La Spezia, Italy. On 3rd October Lieutenant Mott was ordered to move north to an area in the Gulf of Genoa in an area later identified as containing Italian Minefield QB192. HMS USURPER was patrolling in the Gulf of Genoa when the German anti-submarine vessel UJ-2208 reported that she had been unsuccessfully attacked. In the counterattack which followed UJ-2208 reported sinking a Submarine. It is possible that HMS USURPER was sunk in this attack but, she might also have been lost in a minefield. HMS USURPER did not respond to any signals and failed to arrive back at Algiers on 12th October 1942 and was reported lost with all hands. The Crew of HMS USURPER at the time of her loss were:

#### **Submarine TROOPER**

The second Submarine lost was HMS TROOPER which sailed from the Base at Beirut on 28th September 1943 for a patrol off the west of the Dodocanese Islands. The

Submarine failed to arrive back as expected on 17th October and was assumed to have been sunk by a mine on 10th Oct 1943. There were no survivors. The crew consisted of the following personnel:

The Commanding Officer of the Cruiser **HMS CHARYBDIS** (a qualified Submarine Commanding Officer) died when his ship was sunk off the Channel Islands after striking a mine on Saturday 23rd Oct 1943. He was:

#### Captain George Arthur Wallace Voelcker

His body was recovered from the sea, and he is buried in the Dinard English Cemetery, Ille et Vilaine, France.

One member of the crew of Submarine HMS UNSPARING died on Sunday 31st October 1943. The Submarine had been carrying out a Surface Gun Action against a troop carrying caique. When the caique returned fire, the Submarine broke off the action. Whilst clearing the decks for diving a shell hit the base of the Conning Tower and an Able Seaman was wounded and lost over the side. The Gunnery Officer and Petty Officer were wounded. The Able Seaman was:

Able Seaman Harry Wilson C/SSX 27724 who is commemorated on the Chatham Naval War Memorial on Panel No. 70 Column No. 1.

One member of the crew of the Submarine Depot Ship **HMS MAIDSTONE** died on Sunday 31st Oct 1943. He died from injuries sustained in a motor accident in Algiers, North Africa. He was CERA Herbert Anslow D/MX 54846. He is commemorated on the Plymouth Naval War Memorial on Panel No. 81 Column No. 2.

## Our Coast-to-Coast Adventure (St Bees to Robin Hoods Bay)

Five years ago, my good friend and fellow Submariner, Richard Holding (Scaff), asked me if I would accompany him on the Coast-to-Coast Walk. At the time I couldn't, and it was finally arranged for September 2022. However, Richard was diagnosed with Bowel Cancer and, due to the treatment, the walk was cancelled. In February this year he was given the all clear so the walk was back on. But in late August, at his 6 monthly check the tumor was back. The Consultant said the

surgery was planned for mid-October and, with no other treatment needed before hand we started the walk at St. Bees on 8th September by dipping our toes in the Irish Sea and collected a pebble, as is the tradition.



We used the Coat-to-Coast Sherpa service to carry most of our kit only carrying the essentials is a day bag. With what was to become a common feature of the walk, we started with a climb, and headed north along the Cumbrian coast before turning east towards Sandwith. The weather was hot and sunny, which was not ideal, but worse was to come. This first section was not too difficult and gave us time to settle in. Accommodation throughout was hotels, B&Bs and farmhouses. All were familiar with the requirements of the C2C walkers.





Day 2 and 3 were the start of the real test of stamina with long steep climbs (500m +) and steep descents. The paths varied from cinder tracks to uneven paths with stones, and boulders. On day three the weather changed and at the top of Green up Edge thunder and lightning started with the accompanying downpour. Just what you need at the top of a mountain. Eventually it stopped and we managed to get to Grasmere just as the heavens opened again.



The route to Patterdale had the same old steep climb first thing in the morning just to get the lungs working and warm up the tired and aching legs. Not being experienced climbers, we stuck to the standard route keeping the risk at a manageable level. The next stage, Patterdale to Shap, involved going over Kidsty Pike. The climb was not an issue, but the descent was. With a damaged knee from the descent into Borrowdale I was advised not to take that route due to the steepness of the down section from the top. It was recommended that we take a route around Ullswater to Pooley Bridge and then on to Shap. The milage was about the same and any climbs/descents would be manageable, avoiding the risk of having to be helped off the mountain and ending my challenge.



Shap to Nateby (Kirby Stephen) - with Richard's navigation working well there were no detours or unexpected adventures to take us out of the lakes and into Yorkshire. Nateby to Keld was a tester of new experience. Steep and long climb at the start to Nine Standard Rigg and just when you thought the hard section was over there's a 6-mile bog yomp - Submarines not Royal Marines. Just before the end you pass Ravenseat Farm, from the 'Our Yorkshire Farm' TV series. The reward was we reached halfway and celebrated with a proper Yorkshire tea, fruit cake with Wensleydale Cheese.



After being stampeded by a flock of sheep we took the recommended low route from Keld to Reeth as the weather and visibility was poor on the high route, Back Afties not Navigators. A pleasant walk through the Swaledale Valley (Valley of the Barns) following the river with a couple of climbs at the end just to remind us not to get too complacent. Reeth to Danby Wiske via Richmond was a long walk along the Swaledale valley and river again. No real climbs but muddy paths posed their own issues. Ended with just 60 miles to go.



Next was Danby Wiske to Ingleby Cross then on the Clay Bank Top. First day we continued through the Swaledale valley. This was needed to rest the legs before the brutal section to the Clay Band Top with its 6 climbs, 3 in the last 3 miles. The weather wet and very windy on the North Yorkshire Moors but the Cleveland Way has some good sections of stone paths. However, the steep descents were knee crunching. View from the tops were very impressive with our first view of the North Sea.



Yorkshire certainly threw the works at us from Clay Bank Top to Grosmont with storm force winds and lashing rain. On the North Yorks moor there was nowhere to hide until Blakey Ridge and the White Lion pub where a warm lunch (some of it liquid) helped with the recovery.



The next day was a short walk to Intake Farm near Littlebeck before the final push to the end. We just had time to take a short trip, by train and bus, to Whitby as it was a bright and sunny day for a change. The last day, Littlebeck to Robin Hoods Bay, was 12 miles through Littlebeck Wood, more bog yomping across the moorland before picking up the Cleveland Way along the cliff top to the finish at Robin Hood Bay.



The best part of the trip was the people we met, although they were mainly Americans and Australians, with a few silver surfers in the mix and of course the dipping of the toes in the North Sea and depositing the carried pebble from St. Bees. The final act to complete the walk is to sign the book in the Bay Hotel on the waterfront with a customary pint (or 3).



In the 15 days we managed 190 miles, in approximately 420,000 steps, and climbed nearly 22,000ft. Not bad for two aging Back Afty Submariners, one 70 and one 71, one with bowel cancer and the other with diabetes.
